Infidelity: Secrets, Cybersex, Affairs—and Forgiveness?

A unique opportunity to spend a day of intense clinical training with Dr. Janis Abrahms Spring, one of the nation's foremost experts on infidelity and forgiveness. She will focus in-depth on the interventions of her radical treatment model for helping couples navigate the crisis of infidelity, including how to best use her open secrets policy. Specific techniques will be demonstrated to help each partner own their contribution to the marital damage, distinguish between cheap and earned forgiveness, treat each other in ways that foster growth and reconnection.

Poignant case examples will bring to life answers to such important clinical questions as:

- What constitutes an affair? Why is cybersex so seductive?
- Is there room for secrets in couples therapy and, if so, how can therapists create a safe place for each partner's rigorous self-scrutiny and honesty?
- How can partners decipher the meaning of an affair in ways that shed light on their vulnerabilities, longings, and unresolved traumatic injuries?
- Is it possible for partners to heal without forgiving?
- How do attributes which originally attracted us to our partner become targets of our contempt?

Dr. Spring will teach the steps each partner must take to foster genuine forgiveness and exercises to help couples rekindle trust after an affair, including ways to help partners recommit, even when they don't yet feel very loved or loving.

Participants will be able to:

- describe an open secrets policy that helps couples and therapists manage secrets in couples therapy
- specify what makes cybersex so appealing and addictive yet sometimes harmless
- explain how an understanding of contributing factors reduces a couple's vulnerability to future affairs
- define trust-building exercises that foster connection between partners after an affair

Janis Abrahms Spring is an internationally acclaimed expert on infidelity and forgiveness. Her book, *After the Affair*, is Amazon's #1 best seller on infidelity. *How Can I Forgive You?* was a Books for a Better Life Award Finalist. She is a Diplomate in Clinical Psychology, a former clinical supervisor at Yale University's Department of Psychology, and a popular media guest on radio and television.

Erotic Recovery After Infidelity: Integrative Affair Repair

A rare West Coast all-day training on affair repair from Dr. Tammy Nelson, renowned sexologist and couples therapist. Much therapy on infidelity focuses on trust and forgiveness, overlooking direct repair of the couple's sexual relationship. Infidelity is an erotic injury to a relationship and must be repaired through step by step erotic recovery in order for a committed partnership to move forward. She will guide participants through a clearly identified process with three phases of erotic recovery to help couples revive desire and create a new vision of monogamy for those who choose to stay together after an affair.

A new monogamy vision includes a more conscious commitment where the couple creates a monogamy agreement that is renewable and flexible. This new vision of a stronger relationship creates a more sustainable monogamy and a more hopeful future where implicit betrayal moves into empathy and a more passionate, mature connection.

Using extensive case examples and clinical videos, Dr. Nelson will present:

- How to navigate sexuality as a way to find comfort and connection during destabilization with no expectation for the future.
- Developing a narrative of the infidelity including the vulnerabilities that led to the affair and what it meant about you, me and us.
- A protocol of experiential erotic exercises and intentional connection to use along with a dynamic dialogical process.

Participants will be able to:

- learn the three phases of affair recovery and the steps to take to heal the injury in each stage
- understand implicit and explicit monogamy agreements and how wounding to the erotic happens long before the crisis
- learn three direct interventions for erotic recovery and long term passionate monogamy after infidelity
- identify how to heal trust, forgiveness and negotiation of future vision of monogamy

Tammy Nelson is a Board Certified Sexologist, a Certified Imago Therapist, and the author of *The New Monogamy; Redefining Your Relationship After Infidelity* and *Getting the Sex You Want: Shed Your Inhibitions and Reach New Heights of Passion Together*. She lectures and trains internationally on sex and relationships, blogs for Huffington Post, and is often sought after by the media.

Rethinking Couples Therapy: Sex, Desire, Love & Infidelity

Spend a day of intense training with Esther Perel, a Master Clinician, focused on innovative ways to approach the complex issues of sex and infidelity in couples therapy. In this one-day workshop, she will demonstrate how couples therapy succeeds best in combinations of individual and joint sessions. She will define how to navigate secrets, balancing the hidden dimension of sexual desire with the need for transparency and security.

Combining clinical case examples and video vignettes with didactic material, Ms. Perel will address:

- the costs and benefits of truth-telling and transparency.
- how to probe the bonds and conflicts between love and desire through a multi-cultural lens.
- the motivations behind affairs and their possible meanings in different relationships, both heterosexual and gay.
- how to create separate spaces where each partner can explore their individual experiences within the larger relationship dynamics.

With an eye on the existential, clinical and ethical aspects involved, we will focus on how our values influence our therapeutic work and elude the needs of the couple. The workshop draws on attachment and psychodynamic theory, family systems and body-oriented approaches.

Participants will be able to:

- create a safe, flexible and nonjudgmental therapeutic environment to work with secrets, privacy, transparency and truth-telling
- have a more nuanced therapeutic approach for working with extra-marital relations—past and present, fantasized or real, disclosed or withheld
- implement strategies to help couples unlock sexual blocks and take emotional risks
- help couples rebuild trust and intimacy and to promote erotic recovery following an affair

Esther Perel is one of the most original and insightful voices worldwide on couples and sexuality across cultures. She is a celebrated speaker sought for her expertise in erotic intelligence, infidelity, and modern marriage. Her award-winning *Mating in Captivity: Unlocking Erotic Intelligence* has been translated into 24 languages. She is on the faculties of NYU and Columbia University. Ms. Perel has recently received acclaim for her popular TED Talk.
